From the Pastor's Pen

– Luke 10:33 –


Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We've mostly had a beautiful fall thus far, nonetheless, these days the weather is a little too cool for a t-shirt. That means it will probably be six months, or so before I can wear my favorite shirt again. Maybe you've seen me in this shirt which says, "empathy is my favorite sin" and wondered, "What does that even mean?" That's the response I most often get. Others will say, "Love your shirt!" as they walk by. When Zoe and I were in Omaha for a concert in August, one person even asked to have their picture taken with me! This shirt certainly gets people's attention. So, what's it all about?

A few years ago, a theologian named Dr. Joe Rigney, who recently resigned as president of Bethlehem College and Seminary, wrote an article titled, "The Enticing Sin of Empathy" for an online publication. In this article, Rigney argues that to empathize with someone who is suffering is sinful, while I believe twisting what it means to empathize altogether. The implication of Rigney's argument is that to love and care for those who are hurting is to go against God's will for our lives. This sparked a huge debate on social media, which led to someone creating this amazing shirt, and I just couldn't help myself!

To have empathy for someone is to see things from their perspective, to understand what they're going through, and, to some extent, feel what they feel. Not only do I not believe that empathy is a sin, but I believe it could be the highest form of what it looks like to love our neighbor, as Jesus taught and demonstrated throughout his life. In the story of the feeding of the 5000 in Matthew's gospel, when Jesus saw the great crowd of people who were sick, hurting, and lost, he empathized with them. Jesus healed them and fed them. Then, in the Gospel of Luke, in the parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus tells us that the priest and the Levite ignored the man who had been robbed and beaten, walking past him on the opposite side of the road. But, when the Samaritan saw the man, he had empathy for him. The Samari-

tan went to the man, bandaged him up, got him a place to stay, and cared for him. Finally, in John, after Lazarus' death, when Jesus saw Martha, Mary, and those who were with them, suffering great despair, he empathized with them. Jesus was deeply moved ... and he wept.



Jesus summarized all of the commandments in this one line, "Love the Lord your God with all of your heart, your mind, your soul, and your strength. And love your neighbor as yourself." Jesus saw the pain and despair of the people. He didn't ignore that pain. He didn't avoid it. He entered into it. To fulfill the law is to love and to love is to give yourself away - to "lay down your life for another." To follow Jesus is to see those around us who are suffering and to respond with empathy. That's why I love this shirt and why empathy will always be my favorite sin!

President Wade Briggs welcomed Jim Iverson to the Council as a member of the Board of Deacons.

Vice-President Tom Farrell led the devotion on the power of laughter and challenged members to express joy in laughter.

Pastor Steve gave an opening prayer.

Motion by Virginia Lemme, seconded by Tom Farrell, to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

Motion by Tom Farrell, seconded by Patti Weber, to approve the minutes of the October 10, 2023 meeting. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Giving in October was highest in past four years and 3% over October 2022.

The transfer of \$30,000 from the Corner Stone Fund was completed. \$20,000 of the transfer has been used.

Motion by Tom Farrell, seconded by Becky Brown, to acknowledge the Financial Report. Motion carried.

REPORTS:

Pastor Steve submitted a written report. He emphasized the need for communication between the council and the staff. He announced that he is planning a Council retreat February 9 and 10, 2024 at Living Waters on Lake Poinsett.

Deacon Koren submitted a written report. There will be no pie auction this weekend. Kathy McHenry will be speaking between services.

President Wade Briggs reported that the worship surveys have been reviewed. The results will be presented to the congregation at a potluck dinner following services on December 10.

The congregation will also be invited to participate in creating the 2024 mission plan at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, December 9.

Vice-president Tom Farrell's report will be included in BUSINESS.

Board of Trustees—

Eric Anderson reported that the new air handling unit has been installed.

Marie Millage reported that the Hunter family would like to purchase and install a statue in memory of Andy. The courtyard is a possible location.

Dana Hoff will contact Amert Construction about the ceiling tiles in the balcony.

Pastor Steve reported that Scotty has patched an area under the south window that he thinks will take care of the leak in the narthex.

Board of Parish Education—

The Hanging of the Greens service will be December 3. There will be one service followed by brunch.

Board of Deacons—

Becky Brown reported that \$5,396 has been raised for the purchase of a new piano for the Fellowship Hall. A family has expressed interest in purchasing the old piano for \$150 and will move it.

The worship schedule for 2024 will be ready in December.

The return of Jingle Change was a success.

There will be no coffee hour on December 24 or 31.

Home communion was provided to four members in October.

Brianna Routier will assist with publicizing the proposed Christmas schedule.

Pastor Steve provided a team building exercise with random questions for members to answer.

Unapproved November Council Meeting Minutes

BUSINESS

Vice-president Tom Farrell reported that the synod constitution reviewer recommended that Trinity's revised constitution be approved by the Synod Assembly. The Synod Assembly did approve the revised constitution at their meeting on November 3, 2023. Motion by Tom Farrell, seconded by Becky Brown, to approve the constitution as approved by the Synod Assembly. Motion carried. This action puts the congregation on track to approve the revised document at the annual meeting in January with the potential for ratification of the document in May. Jim Iverson expressed thanks to Pastor Bob Hansen for pushing for the review and revision.

Vice-president Tom Farrell presented the following resolution of thanks to Sid Gulbranson:

WHEREAS Trinity Lutheran Church had not replaced the air handling units for the offices and preschool in 20-plus years and these units were failing on a regular basis.

WHEREAS Sid Gulbranson graciously gave of his time, talent and tools to lead and complete the installation of new air handling units for the Trinity offices and preschool.

WHEREAS Sid Gulbranson used his machinery and gave of his time to remove the old air handling units from the property of Trinity.

THEREFORE let be known by spreading this proclamation upon the minutes of the November 2023 meeting of the Trinity Lutheran council that the council and membership of Trinity Lutheran Church are abundantly grateful for the installation of the new air handling units by Sid Gulbranson.

Motion by Wade Briggs, seconded by Tom Farrell, to approve the resolution as presented. Motion carried.

The letter of engagement for Katie Nelson's services has been received. There is no change from the agreement signed last year. Motion by Tom Farrell, seconded by Becky Brown, to accept the letter of engagement. Motion carried.

Jim Iverson, chair of the Nominating Committee, reported that the committee has candidates for 5 of the 10 open council positions. The committee's goal is to have candidates for all offices by the December council meeting.

Vice-president Tom Farrell gave the report of the Foundation Commission. He reminded the council that the commission was supporting Kathy McHenry to present an educational program on November 19.

The Foundation met on November 7 and awarded 8 grants totaling \$14,669.

The Foundation passed the following motion: "According to Ed Hanneman Missionary Endowment Fund distribution policy, per donor directive, after 25 years the remaining balance of the fund would be transferred to Trinity Lutheran Church for any other use it deemed appropriate." Motion passed and the funds will be available to the church council after January 1, 2024. \$7,702 of the Hanneman Endowment will be sent to support ELCA foreign missionaries for the current year.

The Foundation awarded a Seminary Scholarship in the amount of \$1,363 to Wanda Biel for continued studies at Wartburg Seminary. Wanda is currently serving churches in Oldham and Ramona.

Minus current expenditures, the Foundation account has a balance of \$859,579.87

Motion by Wade Briggs, seconded by Virginia Lemme, to set the date and time for the annual meeting for Sunday January 21, 2024, following the second service with January 28 as the alternate date. Motion carried.

President Wade Briggs reported that work continues on the 2024 mission plan. The requests from the Boards are being compiled, and Katie Nelson is forwarding additional information. The information will be available for the meeting on Saturday, December 9, 2023.

Meeting adjourned with prayer.

LAKE COUNTY FOOD PANTRY

CHRISTMAS TURKEY AND ANGEL TREE PROJECTS: The Food Pantry has provided food to over 500 people so far this year and is continuing its regular distribution of emergency food supplies. As the holiday season approaches, the Food Pantry is preparing for the 41st annual Christmas Projects.

CHRISTMAS TURKEY: In 2022, 144 families consisting of 503 people received Christmas food boxes, valued at \$75 each. Eligibility for receiving food boxes is determined by ICAP, the Community Health Nurse, the local Social Services office, and the Madison Ministerial Association. If you know of anyone in need of a Christmas food box, please contact one of these agencies.

ANGEL TREE: The Angel Tree Project is in its 39th year. Three 'angel' trees have been set up, one each in the community window of Gary's Bakery, the Madison Public Library and at Montgomery's Furniture. On each tree are 'Angels' which identify deserving children and suggested gift(s). In 2022, 291 children received over 650 gifts through this program. Most children will be in 8th grade or younger. We encourage any interested person or group to 'adopt' Angels and purchase that child's gift. Money donations are also welcome and can be deposited in the Food Pantry's account at First Bank and Trust or sent to PO Box, 61, Madison, SD 57042.

Gifts should be delivered to the Downtown City Armory (198 Van Eps Ave N, Madison) beginning Saturday, December 9th through Wednesday, December 13, 11:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M. daily except Sunday. The food and gifts will be delivered on Saturday, December 16, 2023.
