From the Pastor's Pen

"By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread until you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

— Genesis 3:19 —

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The way of Jesus is supposed to be different from the way of the world. Following Christ is meant to be counter-cultural. One of the most apparent examples of this is in our relationship with death. Our culture celebrates and promotes a sense of immortality, promising us a way to avoid death. We are constantly inundated with products, programs, medications, practices, and lifestyles claiming to keep us from aging ... helping us to cheat death. For thousands of years, people in different cultures, all over the world, have searched for the "fountain of youth," and while it may have taken on a different form, that search continues with us today.

On February 14th, we will gather for worship, and renew the rite of the imposition of ashes, a Christian ritual dating back hundreds of years. We will smear dirt on our foreheads, and remind each other that we are creatures bound by limits, saying "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." What a peculiar practice. I wonder if we have somehow forfeited just how strange it is that we begin, arguably, our most important liturgical season with this tangible symbol. While the rest of the world tells us, "Come with us and you'll live forever." we declare, "We're all nothing but dust. Here today and gone tomorrow." As the psalmist writes, "Our days on earth are like grass; like wildflowers, we bloom and die. The wind blows, and we are gone—as though we had never been here. But the love of the Lord remains forever ..."

This Lent, let us acknowledge our weirdness together. Let us resist the false hopes of the world. Let us consecrate our mortality. Let us embrace the journey with Jesus to the cross; placing our hope and trust in our boundless God, whose grace, mercy, and provision is unending, whose infinite love cannot be contained.

President Wade Briggs called the meeting to order.

The Council members recited Trinity's mission statement.

Devotions reminding members that we are created in God's image to be givers were presented by vicepresident Tom Farrell.

An opening prayer was given by Pastor Steve.

President Wade Briggs added two items to the printed agenda: 1. Consider amending the general offering amount in the 2024 mission plan; 2. Consider amendment to the preschool salaries in the 2024 mission plan. Motion to approve the agenda as amended by Tom Farrell, seconded by Jennifer Briggs. Motion carried.

Motion to approve the minutes of the December 12, 2023, meeting as written by Jennifer Briggs. Seconded by Tom Farrell. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT

President Wade Briggs reported that the general offering in December was \$61,824.03.

REPORTS

Pastor Steve reported

The temporary cleaning service is working out.
 There has been little progress in hiring for per-

manent custodial/maintenance help.

- The high school youth lock-in went well.
- The advent book study was completed. He is looking for a Lenten book study.

Deacon Koren reported

The kids are back after the Christmas holiday.
 Two more children have registered for Sunday School.

President Wade Briggs reported

- The heater in the narthex has been repaired. The ceiling in the balcony has also been fixed.
- He thanked Council members for working with him for the past year.

Vice-president Tom Farrell reported

- That he will continue to compile monthly giving comparisons for the Council.
- That \$85,143.47 of the \$100,000 that was borrowed from the parsonage fund has been repaid and is invested in CDs at First Bank & Trust. The investments are earning interest that will help offset the pastor's housing allowance.
- He thanked the council members whose terms are expiring with a reverse standing ovation.

Board of Parish Education—Jennifer Briggs reporting

- The last day of Sunday School will be May 5, 2024. The Board is looking at curriculum for 2024-2025
- 12 high school youth participated in the lock-in January 5-6.
- High school youth tied 20+ blankets. Abby Morse received a grant from the Trinity Foundation for materials for the blankets.
- Fundraising for the National Youth Gathering will include selling walking tacos at the basketball double header against Sioux Falls Christian on January 19.
- Preschool registration is now open for Trinity members.
- The Bingo Bash is scheduled for January 28.
- Arrangements are being made for a Camp Sunday.

Board of Deacons—Becky Brown reporting

 A humidifier/dehumidifier for the new piano in the Fellowship Hall will be purchased and installed soon.

Unapproved January Council Meeting Minutes

- The 2024 calendar with the anticipated dates for special services/events has been shared with Pastor Steve.
- Loafer schedule is complete through June 2024.
- The incoming Deacon of Service and Sacraments will shadow the current deacon in January.
- Letters have been sent to the February service group. Arrangements for Lenten soup suppers are moving forward.

Board of Trustees—Eric Anderson reporting

- Kesteloot Excavation & Dirt Work Services is doing the snow removal. They have a map of the areas that need to be cleared. Walker Ruhd has created a procedure manual for snow removal. Pastor Steve will be the main contact.
- Marie Millage reported that Infotech will install a new firewall next month.
- Pierce Construction has completed the work on the balcony ceiling.
- The push bar on the west door is broken. Midstates Glass will repair the door for around \$460.00-\$340.00 for parts and \$120.00 for labor. Rick Schmidt has offered to pay for the repair.

Pastor Steve led the group in a team building exercise. Members were asked to say what they want people to say about them when they die, and following that, if they were to die tomorrow, what people will actually say.

BUSINESS

Jim Iverson, chair of the Nominating Committee, reported that the committee has nominees for all open positions except vice-president.

President Wade Briggs moved to appoint Beth Delzer and Rob Thuringer to the Auditing Committee. The Constitution calls for an independent review of the finances. Seconded by Virginia Lemme. Motion carried.

Preparations for the annual meeting are being finalized. All reports need to be submitted to the office. President Wade Briggs and Vice-president Tom Farrell plan to project the agenda and reports at the meeting. President Wade Briggs will ask Danny Brown to serve as parliamentarian.

Trinity will be helping with the Madison Food Pack on Saturday, January 27, from 8:00-10:00 a.m. An

email has gone out to the congregation encouraging members to sign up to participate.

The Executive Committee brought the following recommendations regarding amending the 2024 mission statement at the Annual Meeting to the Council: 1. Changing the amount of general offering to \$350,000, and 2. Making corrections to the preschool salaries. Motion by Tom Farrell, seconded by Jennifer Briggs, that the Council recommends the amendment amending the amount of general offering to \$350,000 and amending the preschool finances to reflect accurate numbers within the 2024 mission plan. Motion carried.

Motion to adjourn by Becky Brown, seconded by Jennifer Briggs. Motion carried.

President Wade Briggs closed the meeting with prayer.
