



REFORMATION DAY OCTOBER 31

Sunday, October 31 is Reformation Day and we celebrate the birth of the protestant reformation and the birth of the Lutheran Church.

What was the Lutheran Reformation?

The Lutheran Reformation was an event in 16th Century Germany and Europe in which God used the monk Martin Luther (1483–1546) to reform the Christian Church of that day. By “reform” we mean to correct abuses that Luther saw in the church in his day.

Martin Luther began to rediscover the main teaching of Christianity, that we are declared righteous (justified) by faith in the cross of Jesus Christ. It is not our righteousness (created by our works, efforts, and obeying God’s laws) that saves us; Christ’s righteousness saves us. And His righteousness is credited to our account when we believe that He died for us.

Put very simply, Luther’s Reformation centered on the Gospel, showing that Scripture gives us direction for daily living. Whenever the Church was found to contradict Scripture and the Gospel of salvation by grace through faith the church needed to be reformed. Luther’s Reformation was concerned with essentials, with the very heart of Christianity. It is for this reason

that it swept through Europe and had such amazing results. Without this Reformation, the Gospel would have remained largely hidden. When we celebrate the Reformation, we are celebrating the Gospel; and we are celebrating our salvation through Jesus Christ.

Samples of Martin Luther’s Wit & Wisdom

On the Scriptures:

The Bible is alive, it speaks to me; it has feet, it runs after me; it has hands, it lays hold of me.

A simple layman armed with the Scripture is to be believed above a pope or a cardinal without it.

On Faith:

Faith is the “yes” of the heart, a conviction on which one stakes one’s life.

Our faith is an astounding thing – astounding that I should believe him to be the Son of God who is suspended on the cross, whom I have never seen, with whom I have never become acquainted.

On Sins:

Nothing is easier than sinning.

Temptations, of course, cannot be avoided, but because we cannot prevent the birds from flying over our heads, there is no need that we should let them nest in our hair.

A lie is like a snowball. The longer it is rolled on the ground, the larger it becomes.

Trinity council members recited the mission statement of Trinity Lutheran Church, "Sharing God's Word, Doing God's Work."

President Rob Thuringer called the August council meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. Members absent and excused were: Bridget Van Liere, Sid Gulbranson, and Josh Van Dyke.

Vice President, Danny Brown led us in devotions reading from Psalm 34: 9–14 and led us in prayer.

President Rob introduced Pastor Robert Hansen and Faith Formation Director Deacon Suzanne Hansen.

The agenda was presented by President Thuringer and with no additions Tim Walburg made a motion to approve the agenda and Jennifer Briggs seconded. Motion passed.

The July 13th council minutes were presented and Danny Brown made a motion to approve and Corey Strom seconded. Motion passed.

The financial report was discussed and President Rob announced the PPP money has been approved and changed from a loan to a grant and the total is \$52,400.00.

We are about \$40,000.00 behind in our offering. New checks have to be issued to Pastor Sami, Robin and Pastor Solveig as some were lost and have to be reissued to complete their contracts. Pastor Sami's contract ends the end of August and we do not plan to renew as we now have Deacon Suzanne to be in charge of Sunday school, confirmation, and the youth.

We will cover the deficit with the PPP grant and most likely we will not receive another PPP grant so please remember to keep giving to Trinity Lutheran Church.

President Rob will give a Temple Talk on Sunday discussing our financial issues and the call committee report. Becky Brown made a motion to approve and Brianna Routier seconded. Motion passed.

Vice president Danny Brown made a motion to transfer the \$52,400.00 of the PPP grant money from

the Cornerstone to the First bank checking account so we will not have a negative balance. Jim Iverson seconded. Motion passed.

Pastor Robert Hansen reported:

- A trend report shows we are going down slightly
- We need to start our stewardship plan which is living a life of faith and will help with our giving.
- He feels our community has money but it is still in our pockets.
- He would like to put spark and life into our congregation so we will be ready for a new pastor.
- He is calling our members to wish them a Happy Birthday!
- He reminded us we must pay our bills so ministry can happen and money follows mission what God calls us to do.
- We need to care for our members on the prayer list.
- We must recognize our time & talents, young people and adults can usher, help with soup suppers etc. and volunteer when needed.

Deacon Suzanne Hansen reported:

- She is recommending with the size of our church our Sunday school teachers and confirmation guides need background checks.
- Confirmation students will meet on Wednesday evenings and it will be the 6th thru 8th grades.
- Confirmation will be on Reformation Sunday the end of October.
- Sunday school students will be 3 year olds thru 5th grade.

President Rob Thuringer reported:

- Discussed preschool teacher credit card and it will have a limit.
- We can have lectors in the balcony and will check with Joel for good set up.
- We are working on a technology committee with Bob & Joel.
- Discussion was held on the "I Am In" campaign.
- We will have 2 services on Sundays starting on Rally Sunday.
- Pastor Hansen & Deacon Suzanne are trying to get Trinity Lutheran off to a good start.

Vice President Danny Brown reported:

- He reported Lori Schultz has been appointed to fill the parish education board term of Ryan Townsend.
- Discussed our church car and will keep it till we see if a new pastor will use it.
