Unapproved July Council Meeting Minutes

Trinity Lutheran Church Church Council meeting Tuesday, July 9, 2024 7:00 p.m.

President Tom Farrell called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The Council recited Trinity's mission statement.

Present: Pastor Steve Lindley, President Tom Farrell, Secretary Nancy Sabbe, Shelly Balogh, Alicia Koch, Dani Ruhd, Stacy Thomsen, Darrel Presuhn, Walker Ruhd, Eric Anderson, Patti Weber, Lucas Muller, Karen Giles, Virginia Lemme, and Jean Mitchell

Absent and excused: Vice-president Kurt Christiansen, Melody Hansen, Marie Millage, Deacon Koren Lindley

President Tom Farrell shared a devotion from Genesis reminding the Council that all we have is a gift from God. Since we are created in His image, we are also created to be givers.

Pastor Steve Lindley shared an opening prayer.

Dani Ruhd requested that an item regarding the purchase and installation of a lock box be added to the proposed agenda. Motion by Virginia Lemme, seconded by Darrel Presuhn, to approve the agenda with the additional item under new business. Motion carried.

Motion by Jean Mitchell, seconded by Eric Anderson, to approve the minutes of the June 11, 2024, meeting. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT

President Tom Farrell gave the following report: As of June 30, 2024

General Fund Offering \$170,776.38 Expenses \$192,999.26 Expenses over Offering \$22,222.88

Compared to 2023, the general fund offering has increased and expenses have decreased. \$20,475 of the money from the Edwin Hanneman Endowment has been used to keep the budget balanced. Motion by Virginia Lemme, seconded by Patti Weber, to acknowledge the Financial Report. Motion carried.

REPORTS

Pastor Steve Lindley reported

- that the staff has settled into a good rhythm.
- the Trustees have decided to purchase two new desktop computers for the office.
- a decision has been made to eliminate the ribbons and instruments for children at the Celebration

Service. Other ways to include children in the worship will be considered.

- he is leading a summer book study.
- the National Youth Gathering is next week, July 14–21

Deacon Koren Lindley submitted a written report. President Tom Farrell reported

- he is pleased with the current state of the finances, but the Council should remain vigilant about staying within our budget.
- he is happy with the new structure of the Council meetings.

Board of Deacons—Virginia Lemme reporting

- that the Care Team is formalizing a list of those who would like visits.
- Trinity will feed the DSU athletes near the end of August.
- Trinity will serve the Gathering at the Methodist Church on August 26.
- Patti Weber is planning to introduce the refreshed service groups to the congregation on August 18.
- Karen Giles is looking for more people to take home communion to the home-bound. There is also an opportunity for more individuals to join the loafers and make the communion bread.
- Lucas Muller suggested using social media to preview the next worship service. To encourage people to volunteer to be an usher or greeter, etc., he suggested making short, informative videos so people can see what they will do in any of the volunteer positions.

Board of Trustees—Eric Anderson reporting

- the "leak team" from ARS has examined the narthex roof. They patched some spots and installed new flashing against the brick. They found no damage to the membrane. The leaks are mainly in the area where the office/preschool addition meets the old building. There have been leaks from the door to the garden by the elevator. Walker Ruhd will install a new threshold.
- new desktop computers will be purchased for Pastor Steve and Alex Eykamp at a cost of approximately \$1700.
- the board is looking into the purchase of a Life-Vac choking device.
- the Stewardship Committee will meet on July 10.
- Walker Ruhd reported that he is deep cleaning the preschool and sanding the cover of the baptismal font.

Board of Parish Education—Dani Ruhd reporting

- Vacation Bible School was a success. 50 children, preschool through 2nd grade, attended.
- Stacy Thomsen worked with the youth to prepare 20 Birthday Boxes.
- 8 children have registered to attend the Shetek Day Camp at St. John Lutheran on July 22–25.
 Trinity is responsible to provide two evening meals for the camper staff.
- making plans for Miracle Treat Day, July 25.
- the women's book study will begin a new study soon. Alicia Koch is leading the study.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Membership Committee—no report

Kitchen Policy—no report. The committee is meeting next week.

Fall Cleaning—Dani Ruhd reporting

God's Work, Our Hands—Dani Ruhd reporting

met with representatives from St. John Lutheran.
Their vision for the event differs from Trinity's.
The Committee has decided to continue to prepare for a September 15 day of service at Bethel Lutheran Home. Next year they will contact St. John earlier in the planning.

Care Team—Virginia Lemme reporting

 the Care Team is a group of 15 individuals who are finalizing a list of Trinity members who desire a visit. They expect to begin visiting members in August or September.

Pastor Steve Lindley presented a team building exercise involving teams of two members telling each other what impressed them about a reading from scripture. The person hearing that report was responsible for telling it to the entire Council.

OLD BUSINESS

The air conditioning in the office is not functioning. Walker Ruhd has set up a portable air conditioning unit that is maintaining a comfortable temperature in the office. Vice-president Kurt Christiansen will contact Sid Gulbranson about what needs to be done.

There have been some additional leaks in the Narthex. A team from ARS has examined the roof and made repairs.

Kaden Krusemark will continue to livestream the worship services. There have been some issues with the broadcast of the service on KJAM. They have had

some equipment problems and personnel changes.

Trinity's ministry to DSU plans to have something available for the Ministry Fair on August 18. Pastor Steve has been contacted by Pastor Rebecca Breddin from St. John Lutheran about collaborating on a project connecting Trinity and St. John to DSU students and possibly applying for a grant. Pastor Steve and Lucas Muller will talk to Pastor Rebecca.

NEW BUSINESS

Pastor Steve reminded the Council that a decision on the use of the tithe from the Hanneman Endowment needs to be made and presented to the congregation at the annual meeting. He asked the Boards to bring their ideas to the August Council meeting.

Plans for Rally Sunday, September 8, were discussed. It was suggested that Rally Sunday include the introduction of the refreshed service groups and the Ministry Fair previously scheduled for August 18. Following a conversation with Deacon Koren, it was decided that since the introduction of the refreshed service groups will be moved to Rally Sunday, it would be best not to have a Ministry Fair this year. It makes more sense to have the service groups get together during the coffee hour.

Dani Ruhd presented the request from the Board of Parish Education that a lock box be purchased and installed on the wall to the left of the office door. It would be used for checks/payments and should be large enough to accommodate a money bag. Motion by Dani Ruhd, seconded by Patti Weber, to approve the purchase and installation of a lock box. Motion carried.

The meeting closed with prayer.

Motion to adjourn by Dani Ruhd and seconded by Jean Mitchell.
