

From the Pastor's Pen

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

When you hear the term "vocation," you might think of a person's job - the work a person does as a profession; the labor someone performs to earn a living. This is a very common understanding of vocation, particularly in our context in the U.S. Occasionally, different types of applications or registrations will even ask for a person's "vocation." Vocation is frequently viewed as synonymous with one's occupation.

However, this is a fairly narrow notion of vocation. When our idea of vocation is limited to an occupation, first, it immediately excludes those who are not employed - young people, older people, those who are unable to work. Suddenly there are many people who fundamentally cannot have a vocation. But, we also lose the power and potential this word holds for us, as people of faith. Vocation has long been an important concept for followers of Jesus, and a more expansive understanding of vocation contains great possibility for us.

The word vocation comes from the Latin word, *vocatio*, which means "calling." About vocation, pastor and theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer writes, "The call of Jesus Christ is the call to belong to Christ completely ... vocation comprises work with things and issues as well as personal relations. ... Vocation ... is the whole response of the whole person to reality as a whole." With this understanding of vocation in mind, we can see how each of us has many vocations. We have vocations as children, parents, spouses, friends, neighbors, and citizens. Our various callings inform our behavior in our homes, schools, workplaces, churches, organizations, and communities. We are called to use our God-given talents and abilities to love and serve others in every realm of our lives.

In March, we introduced Trinity's stewardship initiative for this year, "Stewards of God's Love." We had special worship services on March 10th in which we pondered what it means for us to be a faith community who views ourselves as stewards of the love God first offers to us. We also had some fun together dur-



ing coffee hour, as we reflected on some of the ways we are already doing this at Trinity. God's love for the whole world was revealed to us through his Son, Jesus, the light of the world, and we are called to shine the light within us - to share God's love with others.

Our stewardship theme for the month of May will be "Stewards of Talents." God has blessed each of us with unique gifts and calls us to utilize our talents, in all of our vocations, for the sake of our neighbor. In the coming weeks, be watching for more information and activities to help us consider this idea together. Then, on Pentecost Sunday, May 19th, we will explore this more with an exceptional worship experience at both services. I hope you'll join us as we continue to ponder what it looks like for us to be stewards of God's amazing love.

Deacon Koren submitted a written report and added that Trinity’s Preschool is celebrating its 30th anniversary. The students will present a program on April 25 and 26 at 10:30 a.m.

President Tom Farrell

- introduced Kurt Christiansen who will serve as vice-president.
- noted that the e-news is now bi-weekly.
- Pastor Steve has introduced Sign-up Genius as an option to volunteer to usher, be a greeter, lector, etc.
- have had a good response to the advertisements for the custodian position and will have a proposal soon.

Vice-president Kurt Christiansen had no report.

Board of Deacons—Patti Weber reporting

- response to the Holy Week services has been positive.
- working to re-activate the Care Team and will be contacting individuals soon.
- volunteers will assist in maintaining the Thursday afternoon coffee time.
- the group meeting for home communion at Peaceful Pines is growing.
- cake will be served during coffee hour on Senior Sunday, May 12.
- the board voted to subscribe to Canva at a cost of \$120.00 per year.
- Lucas Muller and Deacon Koren are looking at free task management software.
- Lucas Muller has approached the event coordinator at DSU about opportunities for outreach to the students. There is an opportunity to reserve a table in the Trojan Center which will be considered for the beginning of the fall semester.

Board of Trustees—Eric Anderson reporting

- Marie Millage donated a television to replace the television in the Narthex.
- the back door has been replaced. It is difficult to open, but it’s working.
- will be seeking bids for repair of the roof in the narthex which has a slow leak.
- there is a plumbing problem in the preschool.
- Stewards of Talents will be the next focus of the Stewardship Committee beginning on May 19.

Unapproved April Council Meeting Minutes

- Board of Parish Education—Dani Ruhd reporting
 - discussed upcoming programs—Senior Sunday, Vacation Bible School, 2024-25 Sunday School.

Pastor Steve invited the Council members to create a sample mission statement for Trinity as a team building activity. This was an activity to foster creativity and to get the Council thinking about who we are, and what we are called to do as a faith community. This wasn't part of a formal visioning process.

BUSINESS

Motion by Dani Ruhd, seconded by Marie Millage, to approve the contracts for preschool personnel for the 2024–25 school year. This includes a salary of \$33,418 plus setting aside \$300 per month for benefits for the teacher and a wage of \$15.25 per hour for a part time assistant.

Motion carried.

The Board of Deacons and the office staff are working to cover the duties of the office receptionist. The Celebration Team will be searching for a drummer. Steve Millage is assisting with the live-streaming of the weekly services.

Two additional suggestions for using the tithe of the Hanneman Endowment were offered. They are the Banquet in Sioux Falls and the Bethel Home.

Service group leaders have problems contacting people. Their calls and texts are often not answered. Patti Weber is considering bringing the group leaders together to discuss ways to encourage the groups to become more active.

The South Dakota Synod Assembly will convene in June. Walker and Dani Ruhd will attend as delegates. Trinity is eligible to have one additional delegate at large, one youth delegate 16–21 years old, and one delegate who is a person of color.

President Tom Farrell asked how the new meeting format is working. Board chairmen were reminded to notify Pastor Steve, President Tom Farrell, Vice-president Kurt Christiansen, and/or Alex Eykamp of the time and location of Board meetings. If the meeting is to be held in the church, Alex Eykamp will reserve space for the meeting.

Motion by Dani Ruhd, seconded by Darrel Presuhn, to adjourn. Meeting adjourned. The Council prayed the Lord's Prayer.




