### **Deacon's Discourse**

"A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

John 13:34–35 (ESV)

# **Unapproved September Council Meeting Minutes**

Trinity Lutheran Church Church Council Meeting Tuesday, September 10, 2024 7:00 p.m.

President Tom Farrell called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., and led the Council in reciting Trinity's mission statement.

Present: Pastor Steven Lindley, Deacon Koren Lindley, President Tom Farrell, Vice-president Kurt Christiansen, Nancy Sabbe, Alicia Koch, Dani Ruhd, Karen Giles, Virginia Lemme, Patti Weber, Lucas Muller, Darrel Presuhn, Walker Ruhd, Marie Millage

Absent and excused: Shelly Balogh, Stacy Thomsen, Eric Anderson, Jean Mitchell, Melody Hansen

Vice-president Kurt Christiansen read a devotion speaking about Holy Waiting and reminding those present to pray for patience and be content while waiting for God's will to be done. Pastor Steve opened the meeting with prayer.

Motion by Virginia Lemme, seconded by Darrel Presuhn, to approve the agenda as printed. Motion carried.

The Council heard presentations from the partners in ministry being considered as recipients of the tithe of the Hannemann fund. Beth Himley, Trinity Preschool, presented the preschool's plan to replace the existing outdoor playground equipment. Jona Schmidt spoke about the Bethel Home's mission and priorities and enumerated some of the current needs at the facility. Beth Delzer presented information from the Trinity Foundation. The Foundation no longer has the finances to support foreign missions. \$10,000 is necessary to create an endowment to support foreign missions within the Foundation. The Council will continue to discuss these options in October and make a decision by November. The Council's recommendation will be voted on at the annual meeting.

Motion by Dani Ruhd, seconded by Lucas Muller, to approve the minutes of the August 13, 2024, meeting.

#### FINANCIAL REPORT

President Tom Farrell gave the following report: As of August 31, 2024

General Fund Offering \$209,033.80 Expenses \$253,062.52 Expenses over Offering \$44,028.72

The 7-month \$100,000 CD came due on September 9. Motion by Tom Farrell, seconded by Marie Millage to transfer \$50,000 to the Money Market Account and

invest the remaining \$50,000 in a 7-month CD at rate of 4.75% with First Bank and Trust. Motion by Kurt Christiansen, seconded by Darrel Presuhn, to amend the motion to split the \$50,000 into two \$25,000 CDs as long as the interest rate remains at 4.75%. Motion to amend the original motion carried. The amended motion carried.

Deacon Koren made the following motion clarifying who has access to the Preschool's venmo account: that First Bank and Trust allow the following privileges for Trinity Lutheran Preschool's account ending 5842: Katie Nelson, Full control. Natae Johnson (Preschool Board President), View only. Kirsten Thuringer (Preschool Treasurer), View only. Motion seconded by Dani Ruhd. Motion carried.

Motion by Kurt Christiansen, seconded by Virginia Lemme, to acknowledge the Financial Report. Motion carried.

#### **REPORTS**

Pastor Steve reported

- They are making adjustments to the custodian's schedule.
- They are making the transition to continue working with Katie Nelson who has moved to Sisseton.
- We are back to two services on Sunday morning.
- He is working on the meal and worship service for those participating in the God's Work, Our Hands event on September 15.
- Plans are being made for Confirmation and Reformation Sunday.
- The confirmation classes are off to a good start.
   Confirmation guides and students would like more class time.
- · High school youth are also meeting.
- He is beginning preparations for Advent.
- There continue to be many needs for pastoral care.

#### Deacon Koren reported

- Rally Sunday was a success. There are currently 88 Sunday School students and 17 teachers.
- There are 36 confirmation students and 7 guides.
   There is the potential to confirm 19 this year.
- She received a gift of \$500 to use to purchase books for the very young. She is applying for a grant through the synod which also emphasizes services to the very young.
- The question of adding time to the weekly confirmation classes was discussed further. The possibility of adding an additional 15 minutes was considered.

# **Unapproved September Council Meeting Minutes**

President Tom Farrell had nothing additional to report.

Vice-president Kurt Christiansen had no report. Board of Trustees—Walker Ruhd reporting

- They have received only one viable quote for insurance. It is through First Madison Insurance with Acuity, and the annual premium will be around \$27,000. The current premium for a policy also with Acuity is \$20,000. The new policy will insure Trinity for total replacement. Because the current policy will expire on September 27, 2024, the Trustees were instructed to get coverage by Acuity through First Madison Insurance as soon as possible.
- Avera offers AEDs for \$1,582 per unit plus \$150 to mount the cabinet. To purchase the same unit outof-pocket is \$2,436. To replace the pads in our existing units will cost \$978 for both units.
- The air conditioner in the Fellowship Hall and the north upper unit in the sanctuary are not working properly. Andy from A & M Mechanical will come to take look at them.
- Walker is looking for a local company to make a ladder lock for the exterior ladder that has been mounted in the preschool playground. A ladder lock is available at Amazon for \$300.
- Still waiting for an answer regarding repair of the trim on the window above the Narthex.

Board of Parish Education—Dani Ruhd reporting

- The Board will order cake to be served on Confirmation Sunday.
- Rally Sunday was a success.
- Planning for a fall youth project and for Halloween is ongoing.

Board of Deacons—Virginia Lemme reporting

- The choirs are rehearsing. Two additional directors are needed.
- The Hanging of the Greens will be on December
   1.
- In August, Trinity fed 160 DSU athletes and provided meals for 260 at the Gathering.
- The requests for home communion are growing as the Care Team begins visiting members.
- The refresh of the service groups has been well received. One additional group leader is needed.
- Invitations to the 80's Birthday Party, Monday, September 16, have been sent.
- Trinity and St John Lutheran are partnering to reach the DSU student population. The student response to this initiative has been encouraging.

 Lucas Muller is working on videos that will illustrate volunteer responsibilities for lectors, greeters, communion assistants, ushers, etc.

Membership at Trinity Committee—Virginia Lemme reporting

 The committee has met. They are discussing how to be more inclusive of nonmembers who are attending Trinity.

God's Work, Our Hands Committee—Dani Ruhd reporting

 All the arrangements have been made, and 111 people have signed up to participate.

OLD BUSINESS (conducted during Financial Report)

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- President Tom Farrell reported that the financial information to be used in developing the 2025 mission plan has been sent to the Board chairmen. The goal is to have the mission plan completed in November.
- Pastor Steve announced that there is a chairman for the Nominating Committee which will be meeting later in September.
- The new constitution will be ratified at the 2025 annual meeting.
- President Tom Farrell reviewed the Portico insurance benefits for the pastor, deacon, and office manager. Motion by Tom Farrell, seconded by Dani Ruhd, to continue with the Gold + Plan for 2025. Motion carried.
- Motion by Tom Farrell, seconded by Patti Weber, to change the date of the October 2024 Council meeting to the third Tuesday, October 15. Motion carried.
- President Tom Farrell suggested that the meeting agenda be posted in the church in advance of the meeting.
- Vice-president Kurt Christiansen announced that the Trinity Foundation will accept grant applications from October 1 through October 31. Awards will be announced in November.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Motion to adjourn by Kurt Christiansen. Seconded by Deacon Koren. Meeting adjourned.



#### **Faith In Action Grants**


