Deacon's Discourse

"Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all people. And day by day the Lord added to their numbers those who were being saved." ~Acts 2:46–47

Nine years ago I was finishing up my final year of seminary at Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque, Iowa. If you needed to find me at that time, you likely would have found me at Panera (with a bagel and coffee) writing my big paper for my diaconal ministry research project, a project that I poured my heart and soul into for three years. It was a project of love, as I researched, interviewed, and created new ministry opportunities. Its official published title is Cross-Generational Ministry and Spiritual Formation: Bringing the Generations Together in Christ, but it could easily have been called God's People are Better Together.

It was this project and paper that affirmed my call to work with not only children, but also with the communities that surround them. As I was doing research into the early church, I realized that crossgenerational ministry has been around much longer than people realize. By looking at Scripture, we can see how multiple generations of families and communities met with the focus of gathering, worshiping, and learning together. Generational writer and speaker Daphne Kirk traced the origins of this model of ministry all the way back to the Old Testament: "When God set His people Israel in order, he placed each individual within a family, each family within a tribe, and each tribe within the nation. No generation was excluded, no child left out, no older person put aside. Within each tribe were the components of family, they were community."

This is why gatherings like Bingo Bash, Lenten Soup Suppers and Worship, Holy Week in an Hour, and similar opportunities for our Trinity Faith Family are so important. We are better together when we not only worship regularly together, but when we also fellowship together, play together, learn together, and pray together. This is also why we offer service projects like the Madison Food Pack and Operation Christmas Child. We are better together when we

come together with our local and greater communities too. Together we learn more, experience more, build relationships, and care for one another.

We have another community event coming up that I encourage you to prayerfully consider attending. There is an event happening at the Dakota Prairie Playhouse February 28 and March 1 called Gather25. This is an amazing opportunity for us to experience God's love and grace together. We are all being invited to worship and praise God and enter into prayer with other believers all around the world via live satellite broadcast. This event is for EVERYONE! It is the first event of its kind, and I am so excited to experience the Holy Spirit move not only here in Madison, South Dakota, but also throughout the world. The broadcast will include speakers and groups from all over the world, including the United States, singing and speaking in their native languages. Through the use of amazing technology, each site will hear the broadcast in their own lanquage. We will be able to see and hear how God is moving in so many places around the world, and we will be able to worship together as one. Alicia Koch and Diane Bruns, along with a handful of volunteers from the Madison area, have been prayerfully planning this event and would be happy to answer any questions. You can also find more information in the narthex.

God's people truly are better together. We were made to be in community with one another for so many reasons. If you attend Bingo Bash, Gather25, or another gathering soon, take a look around. These types of gatherings have been happening in some form since the beginning of human existence. This is how we learn and grow and share God's love. This is how we care for one another and spread hope in a world that is hurting. This is how we celebrate and share the Good News of Jesus Christ. Amen.

Vice-president Kurt Christiansen led a devotion about the gifts that we, like the Wise Men, bring to honor the savior, and Pastor Steven Lindley led the Council in prayer.

President Tom Farrell proposed the addition of one item of new business regarding the resignation of Stacy Thomsen to the agenda. Motion by Virginia Lemme, seconded by Eric Anderson, to approve the agenda with the additional item. Motion carried.

Motion by Kurt Christiansen, seconded by Walker Ruhd, to approve the minutes of the December 10, 2024, meeting. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT

The end of the year financials look good. President Tom Farrell expressed thanks for the support of the congregation and for the efforts of the staff and Council to keep expenses in line. He also recognized the work of Walker Ruhd and the Stewardship Committee for their dedication and plan. The general offering received in December was \$75,906.33 bringing the total offering in 2024 to \$368,476.64. It was necessary to use \$12,063.09 of the Hanneman Endowment to cover expenses over income in 2024. Motion by Virginia Lemme, seconded by Lucas Muller, to acknowledge the Financial Report. Motion carried.

REPORTS

Pastor Steven Lindley reported

 The Christmas eve services were great. He thanked Nancy Moose for leading the service on December 29, and expressed his appreciation to those who prepared and led the Christmas Day service.

- Carpets are being shampooed, and tile floors are being refinished.
- A gift has been received that will cover the cost of bulletin inserts for two years. The inserts should be available in March.
- Confirmation classes are beginning a new unit.
 High school youth participated in candle making in December.
- The men's fellowship is meeting in the Fellowship Hall again.
- He will be taking on a continuing education venture this year. He will be participating in a peacemaking cohort through Global Immersion.

Deacon Koren Lindley reported

- Preschool, Sunday School, and confirmation classes are back in session following the Christmas break.
- She will be meeting DSU students on the campus next week.
- She received a "Sprinkles of Grace" grant. The grant is being used to create worship bags which focus on elements of the worship service providing an avenue for children to learn about and participate in the worship service.
- She is planning to use an area in the Narthex for a communication center for Sunday School parents.
- Bingo Bash is coming up on February 2.

- Home communion is going well.
- Lucas Muller is looking for individuals who will appear in videos explaining volunteer opportunities at Trinity.
- The Board has prepared a calendar for the coming church year.
- Patti Weber is the incoming chair of the Board of Deacons.

Board of Trustees—Eric Anderson reporting

 Two refurbished AEDs will be purchased using grant money from the Trinity Foundation.

- Dani Ruhd received a grant from the Trinity Foundation to create a sensory room. It is in a Sunday School room that was not being used and is designed to be a safe, quiet spot for children.

- With the resignation of Stacy Thomsen, the committee has an additional vacancy to fill.
- Pastor Steve noted that the vice-president's position on the Nominating Committee is not specified in the constitution.

Hanneman Tithe—Dani Ruhd reporting

 The proposed distribution will require the approval of the congregation at the annual meeting.

OLD BUSINESS

Pastor Steve Lindley and Deacon Koren Lindley will address the Mission Plan at the annual meeting with a focus on gratitude for the support of the congregation. There are plans to record a follow-up video for those who are unable to attend the annual meeting.

The Council discussed how to encourage and recruit volunteer worship assistants. Ideas proposed included recognizing the people serving as worship assistants in the bulletin, newsletter, etc.; using the clipboard signup method; recruit a volunteer coordinator who is also a volunteer; send out time and talents survey.

Lucas Muller will speak to Kaden Krusemark about the need to recruit and train additional Livestream Technicians.

A gift from the Bargmann family has been designated toward the replacement of the windows in the education wing. As a first step, the Board of Trustees will seek estimates for this work.

Motion by President Tom Farrell, seconded by Patti Weber, to accept the resignation of Stacy Thomsen with sincere regret. Motion carried.

2024 Financial Response

The Trinity Council brings you "good news of great joy!" In December, our Trinity family's generosity shone through, once again. A total of \$75,906.33 was contributed to support our ministry together, bringing the total offering for 2024 to \$368,476.84. Our mission plan for the year had anticipated \$350,000 in general offering. In order to cover expenses, we projected that we would need to use \$85,138.26 of the \$202,588 transferred from the Edwin Hanneman Endowment to the Trinity Council. Because of your incredible generosity, as well as reduced spending by our staff and council, the actual amount utilized was \$12,063.09. Thank you for helping Trinity live out our mission of sharing the gospel, forming faith, and loving and serving our neighbors!
