## From the Pastor's Pen

Dear Trinity Family,

Over the years, I have grown to regard Mary, the mother of Jesus, as our first and maybe even our greatest example of discipleship — what it looks like to follow Jesus. We can learn so much and draw tremendous inspiration from Mary's story. Mary was a teenage girl living in the small town of Nazareth. There was nothing distinctive about Mary. She wasn't someone you would've picked out of a crowd. Like many other girls her age, Mary was pledged to be married. And then one day, as Mary sat alone, God sent an angel named Gabriel to her and he said to her, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you."

Mary was troubled by the angel's greeting, and there was a struggle within her. Why would God choose to send an angel to this typical, anonymous girl from Nazareth? How is it that she is "favored" by the Lord? The angel comforts her saying, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." But then, Gabriel continues, proceeding to tell Mary that she will become pregnant with a son. He tells her that this child will be anything but typical or anonymous. The Lord God will make him a king, from the line of David, and his kingdom will have no end. And Mary was understandably shocked by this news. She was a virgin and was not set to be married to Joseph for some time yet. Also, if she were to become pregnant prior to marriage, she could be subject to great public disgrace and humiliation, and legally she could be stoned to death.

After hearing this distressing news from the angel, Mary replies, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" And Gabriel responds by telling her that it is by the Holy Spirit that this will all come to be. Gabriel assures Mary that **nothing is impossible with God**. And Mary's faithful response to all of this is, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Mary trusted God enough to risk everything ... to risk losing the security of her pending marriage ... to risk being publicly shamed ... to risk losing her very life ... because she faithfully, courageously trusted that God's Word is true and firm. This is what Jesus means when he says, "For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose

their life for my sake will find it." This is what it looks like to follow him.

So, why would God choose to come to us as a baby, born to an unassuming couple, in a small town; arriving quietly, in the middle of the night, in a manger? God could've come to us in any way he chose. What is it that would make him choose to enter our world in this way? I believe that God chose this path because our God is a relational God. God's very being is relational; the relationship between the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, eternally bonded in love ... inseparable.

The relationship between a mother and her child is about as intimate as there is for us. God chose to come to us as an actual human being. God didn't just make himself *look* like a human being. This wasn't some kind of act of deception. God became a flesh and blood human being, and in this he experienced everything it means to be a baby - growing in Mary's womb, playfully kicking at her hand, as she places it on her belly, being held in her arms, nursing from her, sleeping next to her, being totally reliant on her. Reflect on that, for a moment. In this bond with Mary ... in the dependency, in the emotions, in the physicality, in the indescribable love, Jesus is a human being *and* Jesus is God. This is the kind of intimacy God desires with each of us.

Yes, God is calling Mary to serve him, to consent to a dramatic change in direction for her life, and to take a huge risk. But in the midst of all of this, the central piece is that God is calling Mary into a profound relationship with Jesus. Obviously, because of the particular way in which God calls Mary, it is impossible for her to accept the call without entering into this kind of relationship with Jesus. God's call to Mary, into relationship, and God's call to Mary, to serve, go hand-in-hand. They can *not* be separated. I believe this to be true for all of us.

As I've dwelled in this text over the years, I've really fallen in love with Mary's story. God chooses a relative nobody to be the mother of the savior of the world. God calls Mary to serve him. God calls her to

Pastor Steve opened the meeting with prayer.

President Tom Farrell explained that the disposition of two CDs would be handled as part of the Financial Report. Motion by Vice-president Kurt Christiansen, seconded by Darrel Presuhn, to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

Motion by Dani Ruhd, seconded by Walker Ruhd, to approve the minutes of the November 12, 2024, meeting. Motion carried.

## FINANCIAL REPORT

As of November 30, 2024:

General Fund Offering \$292,570.31 Expenses \$358,596.60 Expenses over Offering \$66,026.29

Motion by Vice-president Kurt Christiansen, seconded by Virginia Lemme, to acknowledge the Financial Report. Motion carried.

CD #6270122335 designated to the Parsonage Fund will come due on December 31, 2024. Motion by President Tom Farrell, seconded by Vice-president Kurt Christiansen, to reinvest the principle of \$10,000 in a CD and transfer the proceeds earned to a Money Market account. Motion carried.

There is an outstanding balance of \$6,716.25 on the I Am In loan from the Parsonage Fund. Motion by President Tom Farrell, seconded by Dani Ruhd, to leave the outstanding balance on the books and to

calculate interest on the outstanding balance. The interest will be paid to the Parsonage Fund. Motion carried.

President Tom Farrell provided an update of the Hannemann Gift. The 2024 mission plan anticipated using \$96,915.79 to offset expenses. As of the end of November, \$62,669.46 has been used.

- He has been busy with preparations for advent and Christmas services and activities, and preparing for the annual meeting.
- There continue to be issues with internet connection in the office. They are working with Infotech and Midcontinent to resolve the problem.

- Men's group meets regularly.

Deacon Koren Lindley submitted a written report. She highlighted the first graders project making Christmas cards for the residents of the Bethel Home.

take risks ... to a dramatically different life. And God calls her into a relationship of profound intimacy with Jesus. And Mary goes through a period of deep pondering, of internal dialogue, wrestling with what this means. The angel assures Mary that it is by the Holy Spirit that these things will happen. Then the Spirit patiently waits for Mary's consent. And finally, Mary answers God's call saying, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord. Let it be with me according to your word."

I think the thing I most love about Mary's story is that as followers of Jesus this is our story too! While it may not come with a grand visitation from an angel, God is calling our Trinity family to serve him - to listen, discern, and respond. God is calling us to take risks, challenging us to do things that seem impossible. God is calling us to a dramatically different life, with a completely different set of priorities from what our world and this culture tells us is important. And most importantly, God is calling us into deep, profound, intimate relationship with Jesus. God desperately yearns for each of us to join in the communion between the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, to dwell in the love that bonds them together. The Spirit is calling us, patiently waiting for us to consent ... waiting to hear us say, "Here are we, the servants of the Lord. Let it be with us according to your word."
