Dear Trinity Family,

Trinity Lutheran Church's mission statement, "Sharing God's Word. Doing God's Work." has provided our guiding vision in our ministry together for nearly fifteen years. In that time, so much has changed. We have seen dramatic shifts in our culture, community, and world, and in the larger church. The place and prominence of the church in society has changed. People's lives seem to be busier and busier, as we have a vast number of activities and entertainment options. In addition, technology, social media, and AI are now intimately integrated into our lives. We live in a very different world today.

In response, our faith community has evolved and adapted, as well. Our elected leadership serving on our restructured council and boards includes some new voices and perspectives. Deacon Koren and I have been serving alongside you in ministry for nearly three years. We have many new people and families getting involved in our ministry in various ways. The work of this group will not be a method of deciding what we want to do ... but rather a time of praying and listening for what God wants for us. At the end of this process, we will have a new vision and mission statement for Trinity Lutheran Church. This will help guide our life and ministry together, moving forward.

In this Easter season, as we celebrate the hope and power of resurrection life, and we remember that God is always making all things new, it is a poignant time for us to be reminded that this too is true for us, as a faith community, gathered in this particular time and place, doing our best to faithfully follow the way of Jesus. I am excited to be a part of this group and to see what God will do in our work together. In the coming months, please pray for our vision team and for the work of the Spirit in this process. # **Unapproved April Council Meeting Minutes**

Trinity Lutheran Church Council Meeting Tuesday, April 15, 2025 7:00 p.m.

President Kurt Christiansen called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Voting members present: Pastor Steven Lindley, Deacon Koren Lindley, President Kurt Christiansen, Vice-president Virginia Lemme, Past president Tom Farrell, Dani Ruhd-Board of Faith Formation, Marie Millage-Board of Trustees designee, Tami Christiansen-Board of Deacons designee

Nonvoting members present: Darrel Presuhn, Secretary Nancy Sabbe

The Council recited Trinity's mission statement.

Dani Ruhd led the devotion entitled Two Kinds of People. Travelers are those folks looking outward, and home bodies are those who are invested in their own comfortable space. Both are necessary in congregations.

Pastor Steven Lindley opened the meeting with prayer.

Motion by Past president Tom Farrell, seconded by Vice-president Virginia Lemme, to approve the agenda as printed. Motion carried.

Motion by Deacon Koren Lindley, seconded by Dani Ruhd, to correct the minutes of the March 11, 2025, meeting changing the third item in the report of the Board of Faith Formation to read "They voted to make a donation to Madison Central's Baccalaureate service." Motion carried.

Motion by Past president Tom Farrell, seconded by Marie Millage, to approve the minutes as corrected. Motion carried.

#### FINANCIAL REPORT

- The general offering for March was \$38,026.44.
- The two \$25,000 CDs came due in March. They have been renewed for 6 months at an interest rate of 4.1%.
- Spending for custodial supplies and for the livestreaming technician was higher than usual through March.

Motion to acknowledge the Financial Report made by Vice-president Virginia Lemme. Seconded by Deacon Koren Lindley. Motion carried.

#### **REPORTS**

Pastor Steven Lindley reported

- Walker Ruhd has repaired the dry wall around the door to the courtyard.
- All staff members are CPR certified and trained in the use of AEDs.
- He is working with Andrea Liddell to be sure essential tasks are completed.
- The bowl for the baptismal font may be ready by the end of the week.
- Lenten services went well and were well-attended.
- There has been a good response to the Palm Sunday service and the addition of the Celebrate inserts.
- Because it is difficult to find volunteers to be greeters, ushers, lectors, and communion assistants, he is considering some changes—for example, reading only the scripture he will preach on, collecting the offering in the rear of the sanctuary, and having the congregation usher themselves for communion. Council members suggested that perhaps the service groups could assume the responsibility of finding lectors and ushers. The congregation will be encouraged to look at the sign-up link.
- He reminded the Council that he will be gone in June for continuing education. His cohort is halfway through their study.
- He is planning a vacation in July.
- The confirmation classes assisted with the soup suppers and Lenten services.
- Deacon Koren Lindley delivered supplies and a cash donation to Jack's Cupboard.
- The men's ministry will not meet in May.
- The vision team has a meeting scheduled.

Deacon Koren Lindley added the following to her written report:

- Confirmation students participated in baking communion bread.
- She is visiting with the Preschool children about Holy Week.
- The older preschoolers will see the movie "King of Kings" at the theater on Wednesday this week.
- Holy Week in an Hour went well.

President Kurt Christianson thanked everyone who volunteered to assist with Holy Week activities.

Vice-president Virginia Lemme reported that the repairs to the keys on the piano in the sanctuary will be completed soon.

Marie Millage reported for the Board of Trustees.

- The Trustees received three quotes for replacing the windows in the Education Wing. The quotes contained inaccurate information and need additional clarification.
- Locations for the AED has been selected. It will be located on the east wall of the Narthex across from the elevator.

Dani Ruhd reported for the Board of Faith Formation.

- Plans for the next spotlight class have been made.
   They will be planting flowers in the outdoor planters.
- The last day of Sunday School will be May 4. Sundaes will be served to the Sunday School classes.
- The Board will serve fruit and pastries following the Sunrise Service.
- They are looking at possible dates for Vacation Bible School.
- Senior Sunday is May 11.

Tami Christiansen reported for the Board of Deacons.

- The cantors for the traditional service have been well-received.
- She thanked the musicians who have participated in the Lenten services.
- Soup suppers were well-attended.
- Karen Giles is making arrangements for pastors to fill in when Pastor Steven Lindley is away in June and July.
- Home communion will be delivered on the fourth Sunday in April.
- Trinity will serve the Gathering on June 16. Vicepresident Virginia Lemme suggested that the Board apply for a grant from Thrivent to help cover the cost of the meal.
- There is a full color ad listing Holy Week services in Leader Land and the Madison Daily Leader.
- Lucas Muller is looking at Nucleus for the website.
   He thinks that Trinity has a contract with Factor 360 for the remainder of this year.

#### **TEAM BUILDING**

Pastor Steven Lindley referred to the evening's devotion and asked the Council which kind of people, travelers or homebodies, make up Trinity's membership.
