Deacon's Discourse

"You must be very careful not to forget the things you have seen God do for you. Keep reminding yourselves, and tell your children and grandchildren as well." ~Moses in Deuteronomy 4:9 (CEV)

As a mom, this week is always bittersweet for me. Currently, it is Friday, and it is the last day of the first week of school for my kids. I now have a high school freshman and a senior, a college senior, and an adult out in the world. How can that be? They promised me they wouldn't get older than four years old!!! But here they are, slowly (or quickly depending on the kid) spreading their wings and finding their independence and their place in this world. They are no longer the "littles" and the "bigs" that I see in the pictures from years ago. They have grown physically, emotionally, and in their faith. And, I can't help but marvel and thank God for all the ways God worked in their lives and our family's life to get them to this point.

Research has shown that in the United States, parents are the most important factor influencing their child(ren)'s faith formation. Parents take them to worship and Sunday School and confirmation, teach them to pray, and give them the opportunity to see first hand how faith can be woven into their daily lives. Another important influence is their faith community ...that's YOU, Trinity family and friends! Yes, you all have a special place in the woven faith passed to not only the children, but to each other. Whether you are a newborn or 100+ years old or somewhere in between, it is up to ALL of us to share in this very important piece of faith formation where we tell each other about the things God has done for us. It is in these experiences and stories that we find all kinds of ways to weave faith into our daily lives and to see how God works in the little and big ways that impact our lives and the lives of others. It is also in the spaces and places we join together to worship as well as learn about and explore our faith that we can learn more about how God is working.

In May I had the opportunity to begin a year-long journey with a group called Faith Forward which focuses on equipping God's people of all ages to weave faith formation into the everyday routines of family life and their faith community. The *Five Faith Promises* from the Faith Forward framework of ministry are 1) Pray together, 2) Read the Bible together, 3) Have faith conversations together, 4) Act in ser-

vice together for others, and 5) Share in mealtimes/rituals/traditions together. While we have emphasized these promises at Trinity, Faith Forward has given us some new and fun resources such as activities and workshops for free.

We also have our own Trinity Faith Forward website at www.faithforwardnow.org/TrinityMadison. You can also use the QR code at the end of this article to reach the website. This website is continually updating and adding new faith formation ideas and activities for all ages to try. If you scroll to the bottom of the home page, you can sign up for weekly emails. In the upper right corner, you can click on "workshops" to see what workshops are being offered (FREE!!!) over zoom. And there will always be many fun downloads available as well.

I am looking forward to weaving some of what I've been learning from my time with Faith Forward into the ministries here at Trinity, and I invite ALL of you to join me. It might be during worship or a special event, or you might find something new coming home with your child from Sunday School or Confirmation. And please take a look at the website and sign up for the free emails, and feel free to pass it on to others, especially family members! Give the activities and ideas a try! I know you will enjoy what you find from

Faith Forward as much as I have. As always, I'm available for questions or conversation! Let's keep passing on the faith with Faith Forward!

Unapproved August Council Meeting Minutes

Trinity Lutheran Church Church Council Meeting Tuesday, August 12, 2025 7:00 p.m..

The members present recited Trinity's mission statement. President Kurt Christiansen called the meeting to order.

Voting members present: Pastor Steven Lindley, Deacon Koren Lindley, President Kurt Christiansen, Vice-president Virginia Lemme, Past president Tom Farrell via Zoom, Secretary Nancy Sabbe, Eric Anderson—Board of Trustees, Patti Weber—Board of Deacons, Dani Ruhd—Board of Faith Formation

Non-voting members present: Darrel Presuhn, Marie Millage, Alicia Entringer, Tami Christiansen, Lucas Muller

Also present: Nick Hossle representing CP Bat Mitigation

Vice-President Virginia Lemme gave the devotion from Luke 12:22–33 in which Jesus urges his followers to seek God's kingdom and to let God take care of everything else.

Pastor Steven Lindley led the Council in prayer.

Motion by Patti Weber, seconded by Eric Anderson, to approve the agenda as printed. Motion carried.

President Kurt Christiansen introduced Nick Hossle, a representative CP Bat Mitigation. He gave a report on Trinity's bat problem. Based on his examination of the building, specifically noting the chimney on the west end, gaps in facia, the bell towers, and the peak of the roof, he proposed placing bat slides in key areas at a cost of \$21,407.80. Motion by Past president Tom Farrell, seconded by Eric Anderson to accept the bid of \$21,407.80 using money from the Cornerstone Fund and any donations received for this project. Motion carried.

Motion by Vice-president Virginia Lemme to accept the minutes of the July 8, 2025, meeting. Seconded by Patti Weber. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Past president Tom Farrell reported that the general offering in July was less than anticipated in the Mission Plan. However, spending was managed well. As of July 31, the year to date general offering received is \$6,232.47 below what was projected in the Mission Plan. Motion by Eric Anderson to acknowledge the Financial Report. Seconded by Virginia Lemme. Motion carried.

REPORTS

Pastor Steven Lindley submitted a written report. He brought up a personnel concern. The president and vice-president will pursue this further.

Deacon Koren Lindley reported

- Blessing of the Backpacks will be August 17.
- First day of Preschool will be August 20 and 21.
- Confirmation parent and student orientation will be held August 20.
- Confirmation and youth group activities begin on August 27.
- The fall worship schedule and Sunday School begin on September 7.
- A day of service—God's Work, Our Hands—will be Sunday, September 14 at the Bethel Home.
- More Sunday School teachers are needed.
- The Preschool will have a float in the DSU Homecoming parade.
- Vacation Bible School and Miracle Treat Day went well. More volunteers would have been helpful.

President Kurt Christiansen had no report.

Vice-president Virginia Lemme had no report.

Board of Deacons—Patti Weber reporting

- The music committee met and went through the calendar. They are working on the Hanging of the Greens service. Choirs begin rehearsing after Labor Day. Choir directors are needed for the Middle School Choir and Chancel Choir.
- The September coffee letters are ready. Preparation for the 80+ Birthday Celebration is ongoing.
- The jingle change offering for Lutherans Outdoors was \$135.62.
- Trinity will feed DSU athletes on August 17. Volunteers are needed.

- Dani Ruhd is working on staff appreciation.


69 windows have been replaced in the education wing.
