HEALTH TIPS FOR JULY



With warm weather and family events, the Fourth of July can be a fun time with great memories. But before your family celebrates, make sure everyone knows about fireworks safety. If not handled properly, fireworks can cause burn and eye injuries in kids and adults.

•Obey all local laws regarding the use of fireworks. •Know your fireworks; read the cautionary labels and performance descriptions before igniting. •A responsible adult SHOULD supervise all firework activities. Never give fireworks to children. •Alcohol and fireworks do not mix. •Wear safety glasses when shooting fireworks. •Light one firework at a time and then quickly move away. •Use fireworks OUTDOORS in a clear area; away from buildings and vehicles. •Never relight a “dud” firework. Wait 20 minutes and then soak it in a bucket of water. •Always have a bucket of water and charged water hose nearby. •Never carry fireworks in your POCKET or shoot them into METAL or GLASS containers. •Do not experiment with homemade fireworks. •Dispose of spent fireworks by wetting them down and place in a metal trash

can away from any building or combustible materials until the next day. •FAA regulations PROHIBIT the possession and transportation of fireworks in your checked baggage or

carry-on luggage. •Report illegal explosives, like M-80s and quarter sticks, to the fire or police department.

If a child is injured by fireworks, immediately go to a doctor or hospital. If an eye injury occurs, don't allow your child to touch or rub it, as this may cause even more damage. Also, don't flush the eye out with water or attempt to put any ointment on it. Instead, cut out the bottom of a paper cup, place it around the eye, and immediately seek

medical attention — your child's eyesight may depend on it. If it's a burn, remove clothing from the burned area and run cool, not cold, water over the burn (do not use ice).

And let's not forget the safety of our pets!

•Don't bring your pets to a fireworks display, even a small one. •If fireworks are being used near your home, put your pet in a safe, interior room to avoid exposure to the sound. •Make sure your pet has an identification tag, in case it runs off during a fireworks display. •Never shoot fireworks of any kind (consumer fireworks, sparklers, fountains, etc.) near pets.

Fireworks are meant to be enjoyed, but you'll enjoy them much more knowing your family is safe. Take extra precautions this Fourth of July and your holiday will be a blast!

And most importantly always remember freedom does not come for free. It has to be fought for and conquered. On this 4th of July may your hearts be filled with love for your nation, compassion for your fellow-Americans and the determination to work hard to make this country better than it already is. May you have a lovely 4th of July!

JULY MISSION OF THE MONTH



“Salvation Army Back to School Shoe Project”

Which pair of shoes shall I wear today? Most of us have a variety of shoes. How many pairs of shoes do you have in your closet? Do your shoes fit well and are they in good condition?

Most of us are able to say, “yes” to those questions and choose from a variety of colors and sizes for each season. For some Lake County students, choices about shoes, their fit and condition is not an option. With this knowledge, the Salvation Army in cooperation with the Lake County Food Pantry, other local charities and Shopko is raising funds to purchase shoes for identified students in need of back to school shoes. Each child will be limited to one pair of new shoes with a price limit not to exceed \$30.00. There are an estimated 140 students that are in need of shoes in Lake County. Vouchers will be given and redeemed at Shopko prior to the start of school. Your contribution designated for “Back to School Shoe Project” is greatly appreciated. If you have questions regarding the project, Pastor Constanze is administering the project.

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

Each year, we are invited to support Lutheran World Relief (LWR) through the assembly of Personal Care Kits and this year is no different. It's a simple thing really ~ pick up a bag and fill it with items to provide cleanliness and comfort ~ a bath towel (light to medium weight, please), 2 bars of soap, sturdy comb, toothbrush and nail clippers. Our kits go to people in real crisis. The conditions are varied and include weather and war-related circumstances, among others. Our prayers are needed to help change the conditions and our hands are needed to help make a difference for that one person receiving the kit.

Bags will be still available in the narthex, as well as in the church office through the summer. Each bag includes a shopping list of items needed. Please return the filled bags to the church by Rally Sunday, September 10.

Each year we try to do a little more. Last year, our congregation provided 94 Personal Care Kits and this year, in celebration of the 500th Anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation, our goal is 150 kits.
