PASTOR'S NOTES

Friends in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit! – "You don't know if you like it, unless you try it."



Those were my mom's words, the German version of course, when she wanted me to try something that would be new to me. I have to admit that some things took more than one or two tries, make that at least seven tries, like Sauerkraut, and some things I never learned to like, even though I faithfully tried, like Lutefisk, and that isn't even German. My point is, that for the most part of our life, we don't know whether or not we like something until we try it more than once. And every time we try, we take a step outside our comfort zone, and we grow.

This year, Lent is one of those "You don't know if you like it, unless you try it"-moments in my life and Trinity's life. I would like to take this opportunity to invite you to step out of your comfort zone with me and join me for an online Lenten Bible Study on Trinity's Facebook page for a total of six weeks. Trust me, I don't even like having my picture taken, so watching me on Facebook leading a Bible Study is waaaaaaaaay out of my comfort zone. But as I said above, I don't know if I like it, unless I try it. So, I am going to try it. I don't know that I have anything to lose, except of my fear. How about you join me? No more excuses, since you can join at your own time and pace, since it is online ... In the end, what do you have to lose, but your fear?

I am still working on the details such as uploading a pre-recorded video versus going 'live', if you have any insights and experience with that, feel free to share them with me. 



THE 131th ANNUAL MEETING Trinity Lutheran Church Madison, South Dakota Sunday, January 21, 2018

The Trinity Lutheran Church, Madison, SD 131st Annual Meeting was called to order by President David Rossing at 12:17 pm.

President Rossing presented the Adoption of Rules:

Please extend courtesy to all when speaking at the microphones.
Unless otherwise determined by a majority vote of the assembly, all speeches during discussion shall be limited to two minutes.

A speaker on one side of the question shall be followed by a speaker on the other side. President Rossing asked for a motion to accept the Adoption of Rules and a motion was made by Bob Ellsworth and seconded by Terry Schultz. Motion passed.

Pastor Dirk led the Litany from the Annual Congregational Meeting Opening Liturgy and led us in prayer.

President Rossing reported that Bishop David B. Zellmer urged us to pray often for our meeting and also if needed; take prayer breaks. Bishop Zellmer also reminded us that we needed to follow Robert's Rules of Order and thank you to our parliamentarian, Jon Hunter.

The secretaries minutes of the 130th Annual Meeting from January 22, 2017 and the Special Congregational Meeting held on October 1, 2017 were presented as recorded. President Rossing asked for a motion to accept and Peggy Hoff so moved and Ann-Marie Rossing seconded. Motion passed.

President Rossing reported on his report and since it was written; we have received reports on the Constitutional Review Committee Report, Kairos Report, and the engineers report which will be presented.

He highlighted that he was very thankful for the dedicated work of our Pastors, Staff, Council, Foundation and volunteers, faithful attendance, sharing of time, talents and treasures by the Congregation's members. He also thanked President David Rossing and the church council for their work and dedication.

Pastor Dirk serves on a multi-cultural committee for the SD Synod and said great things are happening because our church is in the top 20 of the churches providing money for the Synod.

Trinity's mission statement was recited by the church council: "Sharing God's Word, Doing God's Work."

The January council meeting was called to order by President David Rossing. Council members absent and excused were Julie Jones, Adam Shaw, Patti Weber, Wayne Halma, Linda Brick, and Keith Knutson.

President Rossing presented the Agenda and two items were added to New Business. Capital Campaign and Building Repairs.

Pastor Constanze reported:

Pastor thanked Peggy Hoff, David Rossing, Ann-Marie Rossing, and Amy Townsend for serving on the council as their term on the council is complete

Katie Nelson will continue as our treasurer and Joan Merager as secretary of the council January 21, 2018 will be the Trinity Lutheran Church Annual Meeting January 28th is Council Orientation during coffee hour

February 11th will be Council Installation and she encourages all to be in attendance at either the 8:45 or the 11:00 am services for the prayers and support of the congregation

Our Christmas card appeal which was given in honor or memory of someone special and a star was placed on the tree in the Narthex netted as estimated \$9805.00 and we met our expenses but we did not meet our Mission Plan goal

Pastor Constanze recommends a motion that after meeting our expenses, we would tithe (10%) of the surplus, approximately \$800. and forward it to the SD Synod as a gift of thankfulness for their partnership in mission and ministry. She explained that the partnership between the Synod and the congregation comes with great benefits for the congregations of the SD Synod; such as low interest loans, capital campaign services through the Mission Investment Fund, an ELCA affiliate, the partnership with Lutherans Outdoors and Lutheran Planned Giving. Nancy Sabbe seconded the motion. Motion passed.

President David Rossing reported:

Thank you to Pastor Constanze for offering to prepare a summary of the Kairos report for the Congregation. As is the case for all consultant reports funded by the Congregation, a copy will be available in the office for any Congregation member who wished to review it.

At our last meeting there was considerable discussion about the Trustees' recommendation to try to get some of our urgent building repairs on this upcoming season's construction schedule but that we did not have the funding necessary to proceed. Because of this, there was a motion to contact the ELCA Mission Investment Fund and First Bank and Trust. The following day, the Pastors and I spoke to MIF. Their information is in our packet. In their experience, a realistic goal for a campaign would be 1.5 -2 times our annual giving. That would put us roughly somewhere between \$400,000 and \$800,000. They said that if we did a campaign without a consultant, we would save the fee but probably raise a lesser amount. Since these amounts fall short of the projects felt to be high priority or urgent, they suggested that our options would be to do a series of campaigns and/or borrow the additional funds. If we were embarking on a Capital Campaign, it might be possible for them to loan Trinity funds even if we did not use them as a Campaign Consultant. If the Council wished, we could submit a detailed preapproval loan application. The application is complex. I would be willing to coordinate this effort but would need significant assistance to assemble and prepare the Information. We also met with First Bank and Trust. Jon Knuths strongly recommended using a Campaign Consultant and that Trinity might consider using Foundation assets and the Parsonage Fund as collateral, if money needed to be borrowed in order to proceed. It would be difficult for the bank to set up a loan before a Capital Campaign has been completed; and the amounts pledged are known.



JANUARY COUNCIL MINUTES CONT.

I believe the Congregation understands the need for a Capital Campaign in order to raise funds to address issues with the building. As you will hear later, we have a very qualified person willing to serve as Campaign Chair if the Congregation wished. However, over the past month I, as I am sure many of you have as well; have been hearing two strong but divergent views about how to proceed. One view is that we should have at least pledges if not actual cash on hand before embarking on further repair; even if it means that there is further deterioration in the condition of the building. The other view is that we should make every effort necessary to continue urgent repairs this spring or summer, even if it requires borrowing some of the necessary funds. Tonight, the Council will need to decide what recommendations they wish to bring to the Congregation at the Annual Meeting regarding a Capital Campaign; and the timing and funding of building repair. I would also recommend that we try to arrange an education and discussion session for interested Congregation members this coming Sunday between services.
