

President's Message

Good day to you all,

I would like to take this time to give you all an update on the happenings of the church and the council.

Recently the council voted to move forward with Round 2 of the Paycheck Protection Program. We applied for the loan again, and received \$52,400, again. Based on the rules of the program, this is the exact same dollar amount as last year. Just like last year, we will set this money aside until we know that it is forgiven, and we are not strapping the church with another \$52,400 loan. If, for whatever reason, this loan is not forgiven, we will pay the balance in full and walk away. We will keep you updated as the year moves along.

Another major item on the plate of the council is our reopening guidelines. The council is discussing and working on ways to loosen our COVID restrictions. We are closely monitoring the county vaccination rate and are trying to make data-driven decisions that are in the best interest of our church and congregation members. As more and more members of our county and congregation receive their vaccination, we will begin to lift or loosen restrictions within the church. There are many different items on this list that we all want to see reinstated as soon as possible. We will begin to bring these things back into service gradually as the county COVID data allows. We want things to get back to normal, or whatever the new normal will be, as soon as possible just like you.

The Call process for a new Lead Pastor is still moving along. The Call Committee is waiting on another Rostered Minister Profile from the Synod. There are currently more pastoral openings across the Synod than there are available applicants in the pool. We will continue to wait patiently for an applicant, and not just any applicant, but the right applicant for Trinity. Patience will pay off in the end.

Sadly, I must also report that Robin Boldt has resigned as Trinity's Wedding Coordinator. I would like to take a quick moment to say THANK YOU to Robin for her years of service in this role. THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU, Robin! You have done an excellent job for us over the years, and I hope the next person will be able to step into the role and do as good of a job as you have. That said, if anyone is interested in the position of Wedding Coordinator, or know someone who might be, please contact the Trinity Office and we will move forward from there.

Lastly, I would just like to thank everyone for their continued support during this time of transition and time of COVID restrictions. It seems like nothing has gone as planned over the last year, but we keep moving forward. Your continued support is greatly appreciated. Thank you all!

Dear friends in Christ Jesus at Trinity Lutheran,

- We received Thank You letters from Union Gospel Mission, Family Connection, Bethel Lutheran Home, and Lutheran Outdoors for our contributions to them.
- Reminded all the council members to review their evacuation procedure that is in their binders.
- Reported on the Call Committee and said we have received another name and the committee will be meeting to discuss this week. They are continuing down a path as quickly as possible to find the right pastor to compliment Pastor Dirk.

Vice President Danny Brown: No report

Board of Education Robin reported:

- The nursery was discussed and with the size of the room the CDC guidelines would only allow 3 people.
- Confirmation for the Grades 7 & 8 will be meeting and having discussions
- 7th & 8th grade attend Ash Wednesday and Lenten services and 9th grade encouraged to attend.
- Easter will be on the first Sunday, April 4th.
- 9th grade two more formal meetings and completing stoles etc.
- Preschool board will meet on Thursday, February 12th and will be discussing registration, hiring of a teacher and starting dates and times.
- Sunday school will start on February 14th, they will do the kick-off in the Fellowship Hall with masks and social distancing. Preschool will meet in the Preschool room.
- CDC does not allow singing but Robin will teach sign language
- Discussed camps to be held in the summer
- Jennifer Briggs made a motion to allow and empower the authority to the preschool board to hire a preschool teacher in the time of essence. Becky Brown seconded the motion. Motion passed.

- Discussed our KJAM services on the radio and had difficulties on January 31 & February 7th.

Board of Trustees Dana Hoff reported:

- Discussed the new LED lighting that they approved and rebates and over time will save us money.
- Bob Gale and Josh Van Dyke are working on the live stream issue.
- Discussed the Capital Campaign and will check with Jona Schmidt and Alex.
- Discussed the pledges and wondered about thanking those who pay off their pledge.
- Trustees approved paying Sid Gulbranson \$3800.00 for the boiler parts that he installed without charging us labor costs. We have a \$1500.00 credit from parts returned.

New Business:

- SD Synod update by Jim Iverson, he reported we have 215 churches in our SD Synod. The Medary conference will be held on March 21st at 2:00 p.m. by Zoom and they have many items of business to discuss.
- The SD Synod assembly will be held on June 4th & 5th at Our Savior's Lutheran Church and will be virtual and if you would like to be involved, they need you to register by April 1st to May 10th. Each church has so many members attending and to see the rules look at the Constitution. It would be nice for our church to have good representation.
- Reopening procedure and there was much discussion and decided to ask our committee of Scott Delzer, Nancy Sabbe, Danny Brown, and Jim Iverson to review this and possibly take small steps and follow the CDC Guidelines so we may be back together again.

President Rob Thuringer called the special meeting to order. Pastor Hagmaier opened with scripture and prayer.

President Rob Thuringer turned the special meeting over to Pastor Dirk who had an announcement. He had the news earlier today with President Thuringer and Vice-President Brown. He stated he is resigning as Lead Pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church, effective March 17, 2021. He read a written resignation letter dated today, February 17, 2021. In the letter, he shared these reasons which led to his resignation:

- Around 2–3 years ago, he and Pastor Constanze discussed what would happen if she were to be elected Bishop of the SD Synod of the ELCA in September 2019. She was, in fact elected.
- His mother’s health began to further deteriorate back in Germany
- His role at Trinity changed into the position of Lead Pastor
- COVID-19 came upon all of society back in March

of 2020, including Trinity’s ministry

- In the past 2–3 months, Pastor Dirk shared how the deaths of his mother, an uncle, and two members of Trinity affected him.
- He wants to focus his attention and time on being a husband and a father to Emma – “she is growing up too fast”

President Rob Thuringer and several council members expressed their thoughts to Pastor Dirk, saying that he had not let Trinity down, but things were definitely different now than when he had come to Trinity. Many expressed their appreciation and thankfulness to Pastor Dirk for all that he had done for Trinity in the time he has been with us, and certainly understood if he wanted to focus his attention to his family at this time. (Note: Both he and Pastor Constanze came to Trinity in 2009.)

President Rob Thuringer asked for council action on Pastor Dirk Hagmaier’s resignation. Danny Brown moved to accept his resignation, with regret, effective March 17, 2021. Jennifer Briggs seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

There was some discussion as to the Call Committee needing to change its focus from calling an Associate Pastor to now calling a Senior or Lead Pastor. President Thuringer will be in contact with the SD Synod of the ELCA Office in Sioux Falls on Pastor Dirk’s resignation and the need to an Interim Pastor and what steps the council and congregation need to do as we move forward.

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Pastor Hagmaier asked that the council members present keep his resignation confidential as he wants to announce it publicly at both services to the congregation first.

President Rob Thuringer asked for a motion to adjourn. Danny Brown moved to adjourn the special

- He is cleaning out his office.
- Infotech is cleaning up his computer.
- He would like to “Thank” the staff of Alex & Robin and remember to include them in the partnership of ministry.
- He expressed sympathy to Nancy Sabbe in the loss of her mother and Corey Strom in the loss of his stepfather and the several others.

Board of Education Robin reported:

- She reported the SD Synod is offering a match \$1000 technology grant
- Discussed upgrading our video streaming system in the balcony Bob Gale & Josh Van Dyke are checking this upgrading out. There have been problems with the equipment and the equipment is old. Danny Brown made a motion to fill out the grant paperwork and the council approves this technology situation. Dana Hoff seconded. Motion passed.
- Becky Brown says we need to move forward and do some upgrades.
- Josh & Bob will get together and check out costs as this effects our radio broadcast as this is connected with the streaming, and will send the information to President Rob.
- Jim Iverson & Robin will fill out the grant information.

President Rob Thuringer reported:

- The Call Committee has approved the MSP to call a lead pastor. The information is out on the website and we are just waiting for candidates to apply. He reported the SD Synod has been very helpful.
- There was discussion on possibly having a funeral on April 10th and the Covid guidelines of the church will be followed.

Vice President - Danny Brown reported:

- Reported the opening of the church committee has been meeting, discussed the plexiglass and took out the curve in the plexiglass in front of the Celebration Team. They will keep working on

these issues.

- Becky Brown would like to do a survey and she will make a list of questions to ask members of the congregation and several council members will call five household members.

Board of Trustees Chairman - Dana Hoff reported:

- Approved paying the bills
- Tim Walburg will check the bill for the unexpected repair to the elevator and approve it if everything is fine.
- Tim will check on the lighting system with Scotty.
- Discussed the Stream Machine Edge technology
- The boiler bill was approved

Board of Parish Education Chairman - Susan Farrell -Poncelet reported:

- Milestone Ministry–inventory has been taken. Looking into getting the third graders their Spark Bibles, the sixth graders (25 children) the regular Bibles they should have received last Maundy Thursday but didn’t with church closed with the Covid. Scheduling the first communion service for the current sixth graders, scheduling the class and possible first communion service for the fifth graders (19 children) to get everyone back to where they would normally be at this time of the year.
- Confirmation–to be held in April. Stoles and robes are cleaned/ordered and ready to go with a few adjustments for a couple of the confirmands. Service will be at 2:00 p.m. on April 18th, 2021.
- Graduates will be recognized in May. Quilters have already requested names and numbers. Other details not yet determined.
- Summer plans–camps are open for registration; however, other plans such as VBS will be discussed at the April meeting.
- Preschool is open for registration. Change in amount of time children will have for preschool. Previously it has been two and a half hours and it is now going to be three. They are in the interview process for a teacher for the coming school year. More details to come.
- Nursery will open on Sunday.

Board of Deacon Chairman - Jim Iverson reported:

- WORSHIP & MUSIC: Expressed our sympathies to Nancy Sabbe whose mother died in late February. She was 96. Nancy has cantors lined up for the rest of March. Discussed the limited availability of people willing to be cantors at worship. Discussed the upcoming Holy Week & Easter sched-

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ule and need to visit with Pastor Hendrickson, Interim Pastor, after she begins at Trinity on March 24th about what she wants the schedule to look like. The Board of Deacons discussed their April ushering and lector assignments for the month. Nancy will continue to contact people to serve as cantors for the first service.

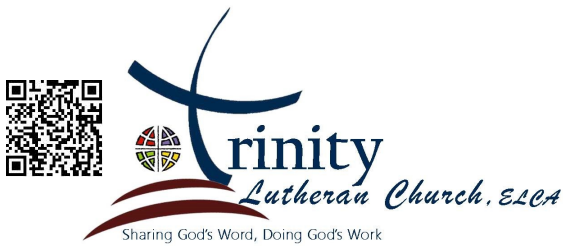
